Expenditure	Amount	Result
Oldham Sports Development	£7215	<p>Two afternoons per week and two afterschool clubs per week teaching good quality PE sessions. Also support with the young leader's program and support with the healthy school's program.</p> <p>IMPACT- Teachers and teaching assistants are seeing good, quality lessons and can support and engage with children. They can see the progression of skills over the year and make sure assessments and data is accurate. Teachers use these sessions as a professional development tool for their own PE practice. Sports leaders are trained up and can engage younger children in more active play at lunchtimes. Sports Leaders are also monitored by the OSD teacher so activities can be varied and pupils are carrying out activities correctly and safely.</p>
Health Champions	£50	<p>The Health Champions have been involved with 3 workshops. They have supported assemblies and organised activities within school.</p> <p>IMPACT-The Health Champions get additional support from Pete Jackson (Oldham Sports Development) to plan activities, therefore their work becomes more effective throughout school. They have become more empowered by leading ideas and activities in school.</p>
Oldham Sports Development Dance Provision.	£900	<p>OSD held curriculum dance lessons throughout school (EYFS-KS2) during the summer term.</p> <p>IMPACT- A specialist dance teacher was brought in to teach dance. Staff could watch, learn and develop their own skills. It also gave staff the opportunity to watch how the progression of skills are taught and how a sequence of dance is put together.</p>
Clip and Climb	£688	<p>Children in KS2 were given the chance to go and experience the new climbing centre in Oldham. They all had a go at the climbing wall paid for by the sport's premium money.</p> <p>IMPACT- Creating a new opportunity. Children to try out a new sport they hadn't had a go at before in a new centre in our community. Children would then be able to attend again with their families.</p>
Royton +Shaw Competitions	£500	<p>This has given A and B teams the chance to compete in a range of sports and activities.</p> <p>IMPACT- Children who are not naturally sporty or</p>



		<p>competitive are given the chance to compete in events alongside children who are similar, resulting in confidence building and being able to try out new sports. It also gives A team children the chance to compete at a sport at a higher level. We have won a variety of A and B team events for both KS1 and KS2.</p>
Resources	£5520.64	<p>New playground, netball, football and PE resources have been purchased to support high quality teaching and to get children moving at break times. IMPACT- Children will have better and new resources to support PE lessons and give them better opportunities. Children will have more opportunities to be active at break times and create games with their friends.</p>
PE Equipment servicing	£510	<p>Annual servicing to keep the PE equipment safe for children to use. The trim trail on the EYFS playground needed urgent repairs. IMPACT-When children are completing PE lessons, the equipment they are using is safe. The children in EY can use the trim trail and be active.</p>
Transport	£875	<p>Transport has been arranged to take children to and from different sporting events. Parents are used whenever possible. Coaches were also supplied for the KS2 trip to 'Clip and Climb'. IMPACT- We have been able to attend extra events by paying to go on a minibus and children have been given the opportunities to take part in different sporting competitions. Children in KS2 have been given the opportunity to go to the local climbing wall and try out climbing an new experience for them.</p>
Project Playgrounds	£4080	<p>Money has been given from the sports premium to develop the playground and support children's physical play during playtimes and lunchtimes on the KS1 playground. IMPACT- Children will have the opportunity to be more physical at break times.</p>
Oldham School Sport Partnership	£590	<p>This has enabled us to compete in the cross-country races on a Saturday morning. Year 1 also took part in the Gruffalo event. The netball team also competed in a 'B' team event in which they came 2nd. Children in Reception have completed balance bikes. IMPACT- We have a strong cross-country team and it is something that is built on in school through extra-curricular training sessions.</p>



		Competing in this gives our runners a chance at taking part in a high-level competition, the chance to get a medal and represent school. Year 1 enjoyed the Gruffalo trail and it also has links to other curriculum subjects so gives them a wide range of learning opportunities. Our reception children also had the chance to take part in balance bike activities and develop their gross motor skills.
Subject Leadership	£1373.40	We have needed supply teachers to cover to allow staff to take children to events. PE lead has also had time to look at and develop subject leadership. IMPACT- By covering teachers, children are given the opportunity to attend competitions and events that they wouldn't normally have the chance to attend. Subject leadership time has enabled me to create schemes of learning for all year groups for each term and create an assessment record for Autumn 1.
Sports Activity Day	£1405	A variety of sporting sessions have been put on at the end of the summer term for all children in school. IMPACT- Children across school could access new activities in a fun and non-competitive way.
